FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time: August 28-29, 2021

Dear Parishioners,

While enjoying a well-deserved break in Rome, Bishop Robert Barron recalled giving out communion at one of the papal masses in Vatican Square. The crowd was huge and the people were pressing against the wooden barricades reaching over each with hands extended. As the strong, or old or small little hands reached out, the people were calling out to him, *Padre, Padre, per favore* (Father, Father please).

For some of us, our sense of Eucharist has become so ho-hum. We have lost our sense of THIS is the Body of Christ, Food from heaven. This is not a luxury, but a necessity!

The Second Vatican Council, *Lumen Gentium*, tells us: the Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian faith." This was reaffirmed by John Paul II who argued the church comes from Eucharist. At the Eucharist, time and eternity merge. Real communion will take place when there is sacrifice, real suffering.

At the Eucharist, sacrifice, meal and real presence are intimately connected. Grace will flow into a sometimes very dysfunctional world from this most holy sacrifice.

A PERSONAL REFLECTION:

My uncle, Father John T. Beyenka, who died January 23, 1988, was a chaplain during World War II, serving in Italy as a member of the U.S Army infantry that fought at Monte Casino and helped liberate Rome. I have pictures of him saying mass, using the hood of the jeep for the altar with young soldiers kneeling down receiving the Eucharist. His aid carefully has a paten under each chin to prevent the host from falling. On Veterans Day, November 11, 2020, the Archdiocese of Chicago put together an online photo exhibit of him during the war.

The young men knew full well the meaning of the Eucharist. Meal, sacrifice and real presence became vividly alive. They knew each other like no other group — who was brave, who was a leader, who had died, and how only the presence of Christ kept them alive. My uncle would tell me that some of the brightest and strongest among them died while others who were half a man of these soldiers, in terms of raw ability, made it through the most difficult times alive. It was all grace.

He and his contemporaries held to this sense of the sacredness of the mass when they returned home. The rubrics that were followed in war now were done at home (even on vacation before a round of golf in the hotel room using the motel room table for an altar), because this was no ordinary meal. This was Christ made present! I am sure they recalled all those at home and abroad who had counted on them for their daily bread and were with them today through the Eucharist, where heaven and earth is united through this sacrificial meal.

Safety and Mask Policy from Archdiocesan COVID-19 Task Force — August 25, 2021

Based on the guidance of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), consultation from our team of medical advisors, and our Archdiocesan COVID-19 Task Force, we plan a return to largely normal, pre-pandemic operations while maintaining select safety protocols to ensure a healthy, in-person environment. Masks are now required for entry into Parish, Church, and School facilities.

As with last year's programming, we will continue to follow the same protocols set forth by the Archdiocese's Office for Catholic Schools.

GUIDING PRINCIPLES FOR THE 2021/22 YEAR:

1. The safety and well-being of all religious education (RE) and youth ministry (YM) participants, staff and volunteers remain our top priorities.

2. The progress of the COVID-19 pandemic in Illinois remains unpredictable. We continue to consult with public health, education, and civil authorities and modify requirements during the year as conditions, mandates and guidance change. We are committed to providing an integrated and balanced perspective.
3. We will regularly review the Framework and communicate updates to families in a full and timely manner.

FOR ALL MASSES AND OTHER LITURGIES CELEBRATED IN COOK COUNTY, THE FOLLOWING DIRECTIVES APPLY:

Masks must be worn by all participants for the duration of the Mass, with the following exceptions:

- **President:** When praying or preaching, the mask may be removed.
- **Readers:** When proclaiming the readings or announcing the petitions, the mask may be removed.
- **Cantors:** When leading hymns or proclaiming the Psalm, the mask may be removed.
- **Wind Instrumentalists:** When playing, the mask may be removed.

WHEN RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION:

- As the communicant approaches the priest or extraordinary minister, he/she receives the Host in the hand.
- The communicant steps six feet to the side, removes the strap from one ear of the mask or face covering, letting it hang from the other ear, uncovering the mouth, and consumes the Host.
- The communicant replaces the mask over the mouth and nose and returns to his/her seat.

Though not currently required in Lake County, masks remain strongly recommended for all clergy and parishioners attending Masses and liturgies throughout all Archdiocesan churches. All pastors, priests, deacons, and lay ministers throughout the Archdiocese are asked to follow the above measures for ministers and distribution of Communion as a safe practice and model of charitable behavior.

Thank you for your patience and cooperation as we adjust our Archdiocesan guidelines to best protect the health of all within our care.



THE LIFE OF ST. PATRICIA



St. Patricia was the daughter of Constans II and the niece of Emperor Constantine. She was born in 350 A.D. and brought up in the imperial court as royalty. Her formation and training as a young girl was under the tutelage of Aglaia, a very devout Christian woman who made a deep impression on Patricia's upbringing and faith development. As a teenager, Patricia committed herself to virginity and to "service to the Lord in whatever way He needed her." As was the custom of the day, her father arranged for her marriage to a rich nobleman and political ally. Patricia refused to marry the man and fled with Aglaia to implore the assistance of Pope Liberius in this matter. In effect, the Holy Father consecrated her as a nun bestowing upon her with the veil of Christ's bride.

When her father died, Patricia returned to Constantinople and renounced all the worldly possessions she had inherited from her family, giving her wealth to the poor and pledging herself to work among the homeless. Her example of piety was a powerful force in influencing other women to follow in her footsteps.

She made a vow to make a spiritual journey for direction in her life and ministry and so she embarked on a pilgrimage to the Holy Places in Jerusalem." On the way there, her ship was caught in a violent storm and Patricia and her party were thrown onto the tiny island of Megarides near Naples, Italy. She fell ill along with other members of her group and died a simple death after a period of penance and prayer at the age of twenty-one. Aglaia who remained faithful to her pupil to the end, along with a number of other women, (later known as "Patricians") founded a convent near Castel dell'ovo. Unfortunately, the convent property was confiscated by Italian authorities in 1864, and the nuns, as well as the earthly remains of their foundress, were transferred to St. Gregorio Armeno Church where it still can be found today in Naples.

Today, St. Patricia is regarded as the Patroness of Naples and venerated by pilgrims who come from across the world to pray at her tomb. Many miracles have been attributed to this beautiful young woman who could be called kind of a "runaway bride," preferring to serve God in the poor, sick, and homeless, "the least of my brethren." In this, too, Patricia reminds us of another contemporary saint, Mother Theresa of Calcutta! Legend has it that a vial of her blood liquefies on or near her feast day August 25th!

OUR PARISH PRAYER TO ST. PATRICIA:

We implore you, most holy Patricia, to watch over the parish family that bears your name. Even as a young girl, you sought to do God's will in your life; please direct our young people to live lives of faithful service to the Lord. You renounced the power and prestige of your family name to love God more totally, and completely giving away all of your worldly possessions. Help us not to be attached to the things of this world so that they might keep us from building up God's spiritual kingdom. Let us imitate and live your fervent love for the needy and the poor, the hungry and the homeless in our midst. You, like us today, know what it is to face adversity, disaster and mortal illness. Give us the strength and courage to bear Christ's cross in our daily lives so that one day we too might with you be numbered among the chosen ones who praise and glorify God forever.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion is the formal title of laypeople who distribute the Eucharist during Mass.

This training provides all those wishing to serve in this ministry sufficient spiritual, theological, and practical preparation to fulfill their role with knowledge and reverence.


