FEAST OF FAITH

Preparation of the Gifts — The altar is prepared, the gifts are received. Several brief rites follow with accompanying prayers, some prayed silently by the priest and deacon and others said aloud. We call this part of the Mass the "preparation." What kind of preparation is happening? First, the presider holds up the paten or bowl containing the hosts, and says words that Jesus must have said many times, since they derive from ancient Jewish meal prayers: "Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation!" We have brought forward our gifts, our offering to God, and now we acknowledge that they are not really ours—the gifts that we give are God's gift to us. It is "through your goodness" that we have gifts to offer. It is significant that we offer not wheat and grapes, but bread and wine; "fruit of the earth and work of human hands." Bread and wine are both God's work, and ours. These preparatory rites also prepare us for what we are about to do in the Eucharist, a mystery in which divine and human meet; a holy collaboration in which our action is caught up into God's divine plan.

HOMILY FOR 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time: JUNE 19/JUNE 20, 2021

Do you, like me, enjoy a good mystery? I think I have read all of the Sherlock Holmes' mysteries. At one time or another, I have also read all of Agatha Christie's stories, and enjoyed the Hercule Poirot mysteries, too! These mysteries, however, are not the kind of mysteries we come face to face with, here, in church! The Christie and Conan Doyle stories are fictionalized murder mysteries; but, we as human beings are made to confront deeper spiritual mysteries that confront us during our lifetimes. Philosophers and theologians refer to these as "existential questions." And, at one time or another, we must grapple with them: the meaning of life and our place in this world.... the existence of God....our need for loving relationships.... the inevitability of death and what happens to me afterwards....and why suffering and pain exist? Our faith and religious belief helps us come to terms with these ultimate questions as we live our daily lives.

Today, we have excerpts from the Old Testament Book of Job, which deals with the question: how could a benevolent God allow suffering to exist (especially for the innocent)? Job is close to questioning God's will when he loses his property, his family, and finally his health and well-being. At the urging of his friends, Job confronts God. "I have always been faithful yet why has this happened to me?" Job asks to which God responds, "Who (but I) shut within doors the sea when it burst forth, who made the clouds like garments in the heavens (but I), who sets the limits on the earth and the world (but I)." In other words: "Job, you cannot understand or even begin to understand My Power and My Will...since I control all things". Hardly a palpable answer; however, since this is the portrait of the Old Testament Deity, the loving presence and gospel of the New Testament God (namely, Jesus) must be placed in context with it.

God wills good for all of His children as St. Paul tells us that "All things work together in the end for those who love God." We know that despite the suffering and pain that we experience in this world (much of it due to the effects of original sin and our human condition), God the Father sent His only Son into the world to show His love for us! Paul says, "Christ indeed died for all, so that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised." Our whole perspective and point of view, therefore, including our acceptance of life with all its suffering is bound to change as "we become a new creation" in the Lord! As Dante the poet said so well: "In His will is our peace!"

The disciples were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this whom even wind and sea obey?"

MARK 4:41



In Mark's gospel today, as Jesus was on the lake with His disciples, "a violent squall came up and waves were breaking over the boat filling it with water". Our Lord slept in the stern of the boat during the storm until the apostles woke Him up crying out, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing!" Then Our Lord first rebuked the wind and the waves saying, " Quiet, be still!" as the storm ceased and was calm. Next, Jesus rebuked the apostles for their lack of faith: "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?"

Jesus encourages all of us—including His frightened followers—to cross to the other side of the lake despite all the difficulties (and storms) we might experience during our lifetimes. There will be painful, stressful, and desperate times; but, we need to be reminded that Christ is present with us asleep in the boat but ready to calm all the problems we might encounter.

We continue, therefore, to grapple with the existential questions of our lives: identity, life and death, purpose, love, relationships, and suffering. We might not understand the "how's" and the "why's" while we are entrenched in the situation and circumstances that most certainly will arise. Despite, at times, our lack of faith, we have the reassurance that we are a new creation in the Lord and that Christ will always be there to calm the waves, dispel our fears, and protect us from all harm!
