

St. Patricia Parish Mass Reservation System

We are very excited to be able to resume Daily and Weekend Masses. Thank you to all our volunteers who make reopening possible! There will be a capacity limit in place of no more than 120 attendees in the Church until further notice. Masks Are Mandatory. Please bring your own to wear in the building.

You must have a reservation in order to attend Mass. Mass Reservations will close on Fridays at noon. We will open reservations on Tuesdays at 9am for Weekend and Weekday Masses.

We are required by the Illinois Department of Health to keep a record of all attending Mass in the event of a positive Covid-19 case being present. After 14 days, all records are destroyed to protect privacy.

Our Reservation system will work as follows:

This is a first come, first serve system. If Online Reservations are full, you may call the Parish Office to see if any available spots are open. We thank you for your patience as we navigate through our Reopening Plan. Please be kind to our volunteers!

NOT ABLE TO ATTEND MASS?

Please note the dispensation from Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation continues. The Archdiocese of Chicago still advises that the elderly and those with underlying medical conditions stay at home and participate through livestreamed and televised Masses. HOMILY FOR THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER: APRIL 17/18, 2021

Stories about the Resurrection of Jesus spread quickly. The early followers were not only afraid for their own lives, in other words whether they would be hunted down and put to death like their Master Jesus, but they were terribly confused and anxious about what they now needed to do to keep the "gospel message" alive! John's post-Easter narrative (which we know to be the latest account written around 90 AD) tells us that Peter and John even after entering the empty tomb "did not fully understand what the Scripture meant that He had to rise from the dead!" Later, in the same chapter, after John recounts Jesus' appearance to the apostles in the locked room—and "Doubting Thomas' lack of faith"— the evangelist specifically tells us (the reader): "Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of His disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in His name." In other words, it was very important for the early church to realize and acknowledge the significance of Easter!

Today, we get Luke's version of a post-Easter appearance of Jesus. Regrettably, Luke's wonderful story of Our Lord's traveling with the two followers to Emmaus has been abbreviated in the gospel excerpt today. In Luke's account (chapter 24), right after the women find the tomb empty and are told by two angels that He had promised to rise from the death and visit them in Galilee, two travelers trudge along to Emmaus—with Our Lord Who unknowingly joins them on their journey. These men share their disappointment with how the whole situation has gone: "how this prophet powerful in deed and in word was put to death by our chief priests and leaders ... how we were hoping that He was the One to redeem Israel...." They are definitely disillusioned, but also "astounded" by the news that the women who visited the tomb found the body gone---and Jesus not there! Cleopas and his nameless companion, according to Luke, represent the attitude of the early church---confused yet expectant, uncommitted yet hopeful.

How did the early church then come to expect to find the Risen Lord? They knew that He eventually would return to His Father in heaven as He promised (Luke concludes his gospel with a short account of Christ's Ascension). But, how would they discover Christ living and walking among them? Three clues in the Scripture give us a peek into their understanding of the Post-Easter experience:

- 1) First of all, He would be with them when they least expected Him just as in the Emmaus encounter as He journeys with these two men. This would take place as they re-examined the Old Testament scriptures in light of what had just happened in Jerusalem. We are told Christ "interpreted for the men beginning with Moses and the prophets all that referred to Him ... and how the Messiah had to suffer before he would enter into His glory." Christ, therefore, would be with us continually each day as we walk along on our path through life—revealing Himself gradually to us as the prophecies begin to sink in!
- 2) Secondly, Christ would be present to them—and to us—in the "breaking of bread." "And it happened that while He was with them at table, He took bread, said the blessing, broke it and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized Him, but He vanished from their sight."
- 3) Thirdly, Christ would be present to the early faith community in the spirit of fellowship and sharing they exhibited. Last Sunday, we were told in Acts that "The community of believers was of one heart and mind, and no one claimed that any of his possessions was his own, but they had everything in common. With great power the apostles bore witness..." As they repeated the core of Our Lord's teaching (known as "kerygma"), they slowly took upon themselves the persona of the Risen Lord. They came to believe that He was not a ghost but "Christ in the flesh:" "Do questions or doubts still arise in your hearts? Come and look at My hands and my feet...Touch me and see because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have...They were incredulous for joy and were amazed!" As "Easter people," we still believe today as they did that the Risen Lord walks among us! **Alleluia!**

CATHOLICS AND THE MONTH OF MAY

First of all, we would like to congratulate our youngsters who will be receiving their First Holy Communion this Saturday, May 1st at 10:00 a.m. and again at 12:30 p.m. We all remember as Catholics this momentous day in our lives. Please pray for our 58 young people and their families: These boys and girls are growing up in a much different society than we did years ago. They will need their faith and religious background to give them a "moral compass" in their future lives!

Secondly, "May Crowning" will take place in an abbreviated format this year due to the pandemic. Our school children will meet in their "cohort groups" during May to honor Mary. Our lower grades will color a drawing of the Blessed Virgin Mary and our higher grades will complete a short essay on Mary. Their May Crownings will take place on May 3, 5, 10, and 12 in the church.

Thirdly, we will have a short "May Crowning" at the beginning of each mass the weekend of May 1 and 2. Therefore, **please** be on time for mass — as we as Catholics reminisce about the May Crownings of our youth in grammar school.

OUTCOME of St. Patricia's FIRST-EVER Easter Basket DRIVE-BY Blessing

Due to the pandemic and current State of Illinois AND Archdiocesan guidelines, Fr. Marc used the Holy Name Society's successful Fish Fry "drive-by" approach on a first ever "drive-by" Easter basket and food blessing that took place on a sunny Holy Saturday from 11am to 11:45pm. Parishioners lined up as early as an hour before the start time with their vehicles loaded with baskets, family members and the desire to fulfill their lifelong Easter custom. Fr. Marc and Deacon Norb lined up to receive the vehicles, while volunteers Bob Faxel, Hank Oszakiewski, and Kathy Siuta directed the flow of traffic—traffic that lined up along 86th Avenue, and snaked west onto 91st Street all the way to 88th Avenue. 125 cars arrived and Easter baskets and food were blessed, averaging 3 people to a car, or a total of 375 people. This was a great turnout and thanks to all of you who followed our preprinted instructions noted in our

earlier bulletins. A special thanks also to our Sacristan, Thelma Petit, who took care of the setup outside of church, and Hank Oszakiewski for photo contributions and stats. It was a success for all!
