We are very excited to be able to resume Daily and Weekend Masses. Thank you to all our volunteers who make reopening possible! There will be a capacity limit in place of no more than 120 attendees in the Church until further notice. **Masks Are Mandatory.** Please bring your own to wear in the building.

You must have a reservation in order to attend Mass. Mass Reservations will close on Fridays at noon. We will open reservations on Tuesdays at 9am for Weekend and Weekday Masses.

We are required by the Illinois Department of Health to keep a record of all attending Mass in the event of a positive Covid-19 case being present. After 14 days, all records are destroyed to protect privacy.

HOMILY FOR THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER: APRIL 24/25, 2021

Many of us have pets that we are close to. In fact, they are really part of our families! Whether they are dogs or cats, goldfish or hamsters, we get to know them quite well over time—and they get to know us, our habits and our loving care for them! We, even at times, are willing to sacrifice ourselves for our pets—making sure they are taken out, making sure they are fed, making sure they see the vet periodically. The household I grew up in was a menagerie of animals—frogs and guppies, hamsters and dogs (but never cats—my mother just did not like those feline creatures)!

Jesus plays on our attachment to animals and pets when He refers to Himself in the Gospel today as “The Good Shepherd.” In fact, the Johannine Gospel is sometimes called “the I-am gospel” since Our Lord identifies Himself in a number of ways using, “I am...” the living water....the bread of life...the vine and you are the branches...the way, the truth, and the life...the “resurrection and the life”.... Here, He is the Good Shepherd—an image that actually finds its roots in the Old Testament. The kings and leaders are called by the prophets to be “good and gentle shepherds” who know their flocks intimately and guide them wisely—and, at times even courageously!



Within the context of the Jewish feast of Dedication here in chapter 10, Jesus tells us, “I am the good shepherd who lays down His life for His sheep....The hired hand who sees the wolf coming leaves the flock and runs away because he works for pay and has no concern for the sheep....” Therefore, the good shepherd not only recognizes the sheep of his own flock but also is willing to protect them with his life. “I am the good shepherd and I know mine and mine know me.... just as the Father knows me and I know the Father....” There exists then a close-knit bond between shepherd and sheep—much like our bond and affinity to our household pets!

Peter, in this post-Easter reading from Acts, begins by simply justifying his healing of the poor cripple, but, the scene takes on greater significance! His speech has wider ramifications as he preaches in a “kerygmatic style” about the power that emanates from Jesus’ name whom the Jews put to death. We can hardly recognize the newly energized Peter when he says, “It was in the name of Jesus Christ the Nazorean whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead; in His name this man stands before you healed.” He concludes his address to the Pharisees by quoting Psalm 118, a psalm that they certainly would have been familiar with: “He is the stone rejected by you the builders which has become the cornerstone...there is no salvation through any other name but His....”

Again, this weekend we hear an excerpt from the letter of St. John. We hear that we have special privileges in being the “children of God:” “Beloved, see what love the Father has bestowed on us that we may be called the children of God for so indeed we are....” This means that we not merely are made to keep the commandments; but that we are furthermore drawn into a familial relationship, one marked by concern and fellowship for one another. The Risen Lord reveals Himself to us in such a community of believers. As Easter people and followers of the Lord Jesus, we seek His Presence among us. John tells us, “We are God’s children now; what we shall be has not yet been revealed. We do know that when it is revealed we shall be like Him, for we shall see Him as He is.”

First of all, on this “Good Shepherd Weekend” we realize that we have been well-cared for and loved by Jesus Who shepherds us. He knows us intimately, when we stray away from the flock. He searches for us and brings us back. In fact, He protects us against all attackers—and has willingly laid down His life for us (on the cross)! Secondly, we come to realize that there is great power in the name of Jesus—as Peter (transformed man that he has become) shows us when he heals the cripple defying the Jewish leaders who crucified Christ! And finally or thirdly, we have been specially privileged to be part of God’s family (and the Christian community of believers) in being the “children of God.” As we continue to celebrate this holy season, we know the Risen Lord walks among us! **Alleluia!**

CATHOLICS AND THE MONTH OF MAY

First of all, we would like to congratulate our youngsters who have received their First Holy Communion on Saturday, May 1st at 10:00 a.m. and again at 12:30 p.m. We all remember as Catholics this momentous day in our lives. Please pray for our 58 young people and their families: These boys and girls are growing up in a much different society than we did years ago. They will need their faith and religious background to give them a "moral compass" in their future lives!

Secondly, "May Crowning" will take place in an abbreviated format this year due to the pandemic. Our school children will meet in their "cohort groups" during May to honor Mary. Our lower grades will color a drawing of the Blessed Virgin Mary and our higher grades will complete a short essay on Mary. Their May Crownings will take place on May 3, 5, 10, and 12 in the church.

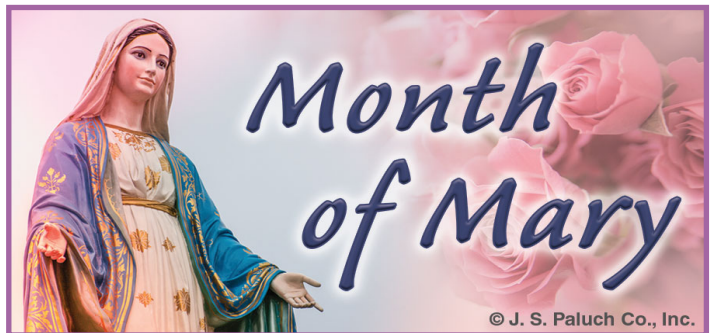

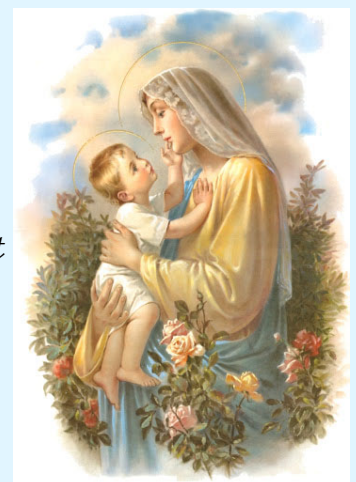

COVID-19 Vaccinations Available to Homebound Individuals

Pathlights, formerly known as PLOWS Council on Aging, is partnering with AgeOptions and the Cook County Department of Public Health (CCDPH) to provide in-home COVID-19 vaccinations for suburban Cook County residents who are unable to leave home due to age, disability, or medical impairment.*

To be eligible for this program you must live in the jurisdiction of CCDPH (all of Cook County except for Chicago, Skokie, Evanston, Oak Park and Stickney) and:

Be a senior (65+) OR a person with a disability who requires in-home assistance.	OR Have to use adaptive equipment (like a ventilator, crutches, a walker, a wheelchair, etc.) and/or accessible transportation to leave home.	AND Leaving home is not an option for you because doing so requires considerable and taxing effort.

*NOTE: The quickest way to get a vaccine is to participate in a vaccination clinic outside of the home. There are options for drive-through clinics where no additional walking is required. To see other vaccination options visit <https://vaccine.cookcountyl.gov/> or call 833-308-1988.

If you or someone you know fits the criteria, you can sign-up by calling the Vaccine Sign-Up Hotline: 833-308-1988 M-F 7am-10pm and Sat 8a-10pm CT or <http://bit.ly/homevaccine>

After sign-up, you will receive a confirmation email or phone call from one of CCDPH's COVID-19 Vaccine Provider Partners to schedule your in-home vaccination when the vaccine is available to you. Please be patient as we respond to a large number of requests. As always, we are available should you have questions.

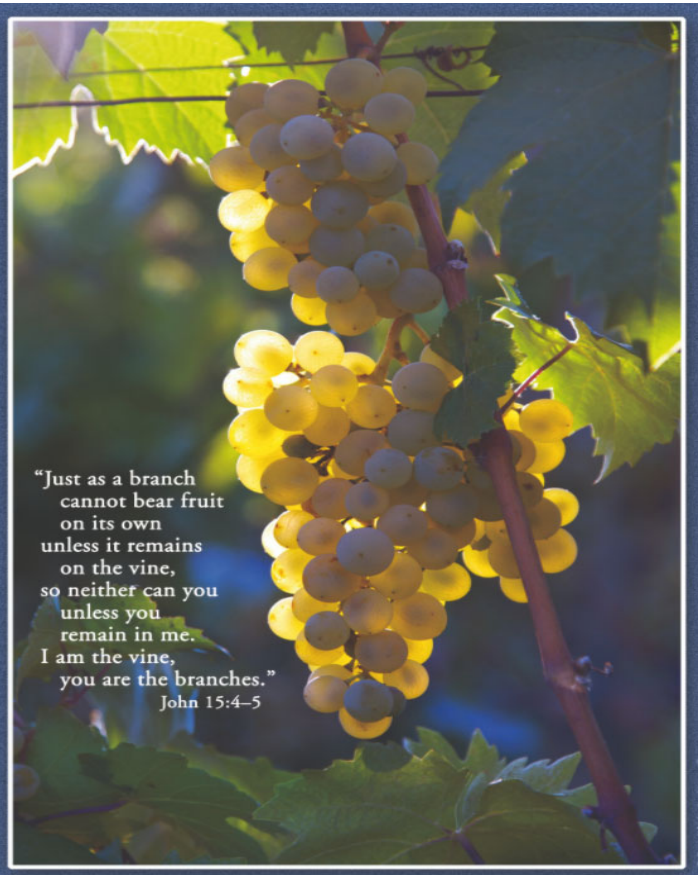

BEARING FRUIT

Few of us, even when we meditate on the image of the vine and branches, stop to really think about how God “prunes” us. For some, there is the danger of thinking that we are already producing fruit for the kingdom, in deed and truth as John says, perhaps raising a family, being active in our parish, and so on. But, even those branches which are bearing fruit, the Gospel tells us, can be pruned to produce still more. Today Saul, freshly “pruned” by his conversion, arrives in Jerusalem and meets resistance. Since he had been persecuting Christians, this was only natural. But even after he is accepted and begins to bear fruit, he meets further adversity, and his letters are filled with many accounts of how his trials “pruned” him to produce greater fruit for the kingdom. Like him, as long as we remain in Christ we will continue to bear fruit and, when the will of the Father determines it is time to prune us, the strength of the true vine must enable us to endure it.

FEAST OF FAITH

The Homily

The ambo, or pulpit, is a special place—it is the place for God’s word. That is why it is not used for all the spoken words of the Mass, even important words like the collects and the blessing. The ambo is only used for the scripture readings, and for the homily and the prayer of the faithful.

The homily is part of the Liturgy of the Word. It flows from the readings we have just heard, and helps us to understand the way in which God is speaking to us today. The homily is not a lecture, a catechism lesson, or a speech. It is more like an exhortation; it has an urgency about it, for it calls us to find ourselves in the scripture, to live the faith we profess, to see our world by the light of the Gospel. The homily, in itself a response to God’s word, demands a response from us. There are many styles of preaching and many ways to respond to the scriptures. But whether the homily is weak or strong, an open ear and an open heart can find in it an abundance of spiritual nourishment.

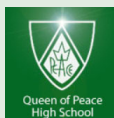
